too difficult to treat there and doctors recommended surgery at a hospital 4 hours away. Any hope her parents had rapidly dissolved. They had no money for travel, no money for treatment.



Afraid and in pain

Mary cried and begged her parents to take her home to let her die. Let her die? Others listening and watching this unfold at the hospital contacted Olalo for help.

Taking to social media to help with surgery costs, you responded quickly and gave generously.

Your generosity allowed for traveling from town

to town as each hospital sent us to another for help. You covered the medical, transport, food and lodging costs for them. Ultimately they flew to a hospital in Nairobi.

Doctors quickly

He's Just 19 and About to Lose His Leg....



Beginning his journey to diagnose the swelling leg.

Felix needs your help!

Not too long ago he noticed a large swelling just below his knee and the beginning of what would become excruciating pains.

X-rays revealed deteriorating bones beneath the swelling which was now looking more like a rapidly growing tumor.

Felix and his mum are traveling many hours between three different

hospitals for biopsies, MRIs, CT scans and more x-rays. The distances between hospitals means the costs of lodging, travel and food are quickly adding up with many more appointments in his future yet to come.

Felix needs your help to cover these accumulating costs and those future hospital treatments.

Sadly, the biopsy and scan test results have indicated the tumor on his leg is cancer.

The American doctors at Tenwek have sent all the test results to the U.S. for consultation and have seriously discussed amputating his leg. Not a promising prospect for such a young man.
